The new mobile order and pay option (MOaP) feature lets you pay securely using your debit or credit card, Apple Pay, or Google Pay™ - all from within the MyMacca's app. That means less hanging around upon pick up and more time enjoying your meal.

If you opt for dine-in, simply scan the QR code on your table, and your order will be delivered to you. (For Drive Thru orders, our crew starts preparing your food when you arrive—ensuring it's always fresh and delicious.)
